CSRA AmRRON Daily Summary 2018_09_16

Key Judgments:

Rainfall and winds are continuing to cause catastrophic damage across NC. Rivers are beginning to rise in the affected area due to the excessive rainfall.

AmCON Level remains at Level-1 (Active Incident – Regional).

Introduction:

Tropical depression Florence is moving toward the north near 14 mph and this motion is expected to accelerate to the north today and tonight before turning eastward across Southern New England on Tuesday.

Tropical storm Florence at 1700L 16 September, was centered about 25 miles south-southeast of Greenville, SC and 60 miles south-southeast of Asheville, NC moving north at 14mph. The maximum sustained winds are 35 mph and the minimum central pressure is 1006millibars.

Recovery operations are ongoing along the coast of North Carolina.

Information:

Continuing to monitor nets and health and wellness of Golf-8-Romeo in Wilmington.

Local operators are watching the following key infrastructure: lakes, roadways, shelter sites, hotels, etc.

Murray at 354.63 feet with full pool at 360.0 feet at 2030L, 16 Sep
Oconee at 434.51 feet with full pool at 435.0 feet at 0700L, 16 Sep
Russell at 471.86 feet with full pool at 475.0 feet at 2000L, 16 Sep

Outlook:

Emergency services and volunteers have been conducting rescues in many areas. Reports from Piedmont Triad operators indicate the Lumberton-Jacksonville-Wilmington NC area to be the hardest hit with the affected area increasing based on flooding impact.
