## HOW TO FIND ALL THE LOCAL FREQUENCIES IN YOUR AREA:

- POLICE/FIRE/EMS
- AMATEUR RADIO
- GOVERNMENT SERVICES
- AIRCRAFT/AIRPORTS
- SCHOOLS AND BUSINESSES
- RAILROADS
- MORE!

Many of frequencies (but not all) may be programmed into your VHF/UHF handheld radios for you to listen in. But this should NOT be your only plan for monitoring/listening to local agencies and other radio communications.

### Effective April 6th, 2023

We understand this will be difficult for some, and easier for others. There is no way to create a schedule which works for everyone, all the time.

In the end, this decision was reached after careful study of propagation and band conditions at varying times of the year. 80 meters performs best as close to sunset as possible, and afterward. Thanks for understanding, and for being flexible.
